**SUBJECT: OAKRIDGE MOBILE HOME PARK - DEBRIS REMOVAL PHASE**

The Contract for the Oakridge Mobile Home Park debris removal has been awarded. Physical barriers will be placed on March 4th, at all Park entrances. Complete access closure will be maintained during the construction activity. No other individuals other than contractor personnel and City staff will be given access into the Oakridge Mobile Home Park until the debris removal process is concluded. All participating City departments, in partnership with FEMA and CalEMA, are diligently pushing timelines to completion.

The park remains under the "Declaration of a Public Health Hazard Associated with Fire Ash and Debris" as administered and issued on December 22, 2008 by the Los Angeles County Public Health Officer. It is anticipated that the extensive construction activity will entail vigorous soil upheaval. Health and safety remains a top priority. We understand and are sensitive to the concerns of the impacted residents, but the City of Los Angeles must maintain the intent of the health advisory. Residents will not be granted access during the debris removal phase.
